

Close Read Directions

Close reads can be done whole class or small group. Here is a basic format to help you get started while hitting the most standards that you can with one reading activity!

- I. Teacher reads the passage aloud. Ask students to track the words with their finger.
- Students choral read aloud with teacher.
 Ask students to track the words with their finger as they read with you.
- 3. Analyze the text:
 - Look for sight words. Color or highlight the sight words they can find.
 - Look for the words with the focus phonics sound. Color or highlight the words they can find (different color).
 - Circle, star, or highlight any unknown words. Have a class discussion about the new vocabulary.

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
Close Read Directions

- 4. Answer the comprehension questions as a class.
 - Ask students to point to the first question, and read it together.
 - I prompt my class to learn a phrase where I say, "Hmmm... I know! Where can we find the answer..." And they reply "in the story!"
 - Go back and read the story with the class orally once again. But this time, remind them that "We are reading to find out ______."
 - You can ease off your reading as the the class becomes more confident reading together on their own.
 - After you read the whole passage, they can partner share their answer, citing their EVIDENCE (or sentence number). I teach my class that "evidence" is how we know something is true.
 - Write the answer to the question in a complete sentence.
 - You can repeat this process for all three questions, or slowly release them to read and respond on their own.

Close Read Directions

- 5. On the back side of the paper, there will be one extension question where the students will predict, infer, or extend the story on their own.
- 6. There will also be a few independent activities for students to practice and use the focus sound.
 - During this time, you can pull back a small group of students who might need more assistance on the previous questions!

I hope this serves as a step-by-step plan for teaching our kiddos how to analyze text- WHILE reading a story with a phonics focus!

This is a skill that teaches how to identify sentence structure, draws attention to punctuation marks, and shows proper paragraph formation.

It takes a few practices to get the hang of it. But once they do it will be worth it!

You could also use this format for your more advanced readers simultaneously with the class. The story and questions are the same, just formatted differently.


